Students must also complete 4 advanced measures to graduate on the Distinguished Plan. These advanced measures can be a combination of AP courses (with a score of 3 or above on the AP exam), Dual Enrollment or articulated courses with a grade of "B" or better, score on the NMSQT that qualifies a student as a commended scholar or higher, and judged original research projects on a college or professional level.

Weighted Class Rank Calculation

The weighted GPA is determined by semester grades earned in the core courses (English, Math, Science, Socials Studies, and Languages Other Than English). Core level courses are calculated based on a 5.0 scale. Advanced academic courses (GT, Pre-AP, AP, dual credit, college courses) are calculated on a 6.0 scale. Elective courses and local credit courses are not included in the calculation of the weighted GPA and academic class rank.
